- Practice listening
- Practice speaking
- Share student writing
- Create online or printed presentations
- Share classroom events with families
- Discuss current events
- Review and celebrate what we've learned

SAFETY

In the interest of students' safety, the following protections will be in place for our use of these tools:

- Student work on the wiki will be behind a log-in for privacy unless specifically designed

for internet safety practice and net-etiquette

- Student posts and comments on Kidblog will be monitored and approved by Mrs. Haugen
- Only students, parents, and staff members with a related interest to this class will be able to SEE the work created by our class on the wiki unless specifically designed for internet safety practice and net-etiquette
- The public will be able to see our Kidblog work (with first names only) but not any other identifiable information about our students
- Everything we make with the tools is subject to teacher approval and/or deletion.
- Mrs. Haugen will be notified of any changes to student work on the wiki (it's automatic)
- All student-made work on the wiki will be removed from public view after the school year 2010/2011 has ended
- No individual or identifiable "profiles" will be used
